REMINDER TO MEMBERS!!!

If you purchased your membership on-line, you will receive 4 reminder emails to let you know that your membership is about to expire. The first email will arrive 30 days before your Anniversary date as shown on your membership card. The second email will arrive 14 days before your Anniversary Date. The third email will arrive 7 days after your Anniversary date and the last email will arrive 14 days after your Anniversary Date. Finally, if you haven't renewed by 30 days after your Anniversary date, you will receive an email to let you know that your membership has expired.

If you purchased your membership at one of our retailers, you will receive only 2 reminder emails. The first will arrive 30 days before your Anniversary date and if you haven't renewed by 30 days after your Anniversary date, you will receive the expiry email.
